The Most Holy Trinity Sunday—June 11, 2017

What's in a name? Does it really make a difference?

Change of any kind comes slowly to most of us, and that is particularly true in our Church. Many times it takes generations for renewal to be accepted. That is also true for terminology. Because we are human we have a tendency to think that if a particular thing has been done the same way in our lifetime or has been called by the same name it must have been this way since the beginning, is now and shall be world without end.

This is particularly true with sacraments. Many times we will get a phone call asking us to come and give someone the 'Last Rites.' In news reports and in newspaper accounts you will hear or read that someone, particularly a public figure or someone in the entertainment industry, received the 'Last Rites' before they died.

All of us have heard stories and statements that go something like this: "Don't call for the priest yet, grandma will think she's dying if she sees the priest walk in. It's to early yet."

In November 1982 *Pastoral Care of the Sick: Rites of Anointing and Viaticum* was canonically approved by the Bishops of the United States and approved by the Sacred Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments in Rome. This was not something new for our Church but rather a restoration of the traditional understanding of this sacrament. In 1982 we technically stopped using the term, 'Last Rites' for the anointing.

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is just that, a sacrament that is to be administered while the person is sick. The Letter of Saint James, that is the basis for this sacrament specifically says, *"Is anyone among you sick? He should summon the presbyters of the Church, and they should pray over him and anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord. And the prayer of faith will save the sick person and the Lord will raise him up. If he has committed any sins, he will be forgiven."*

The decree that restored this sacrament states that it "is not a sacrament for those only who are at the point of death. Hence, as soon as any one of the faithful begins to be in danger of death from sickness or old age, the fitting time for that person to receive this sacrament has certainly already arrived."

If a person knows in advance that they are entering the hospital for surgery or tests, it is quite appropriate and advantageous to receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick before being admitted.

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick does have rites for the dying that include the anointing, but also includes a commendation of the dying and the reception of Holy Communion, called 'Viaticum' or 'Food for the Journey,' if the person is able to receive the Eucharist.

10 Signs of a SAFE PROGRAM for Children and Youth

1. **Screening** of staff and volunteers.
2. Adults trained in **Safe Environment Strategies** and **signs of abuse**.
3. **Code of conduct** enforced.
4. **Open Communication** between parents and staff/staff and children/children and parents.
5. **Parents** always **Welcome**.
6. Children educated in **right relationships** and **what to do if a relationship isn't right**.
7. All children treated with **Dignity and Respect**.
8. **Clear Rules and Expectations**.
Consistent reinforcement/consequences.
9. **Adequate supervision of youth**.
Team approach–accountability–no 1:1 isolation.
10. All **abuse** is reported.
