If you have not attended either of the first two sessions, you **MUST** attend this meeting in order to register your child for Faith Formation classes beginning in September 2017.

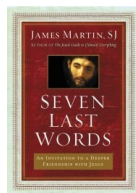
Adult Confirmation Classes

Stations of the Cross

The 'Stations of the Cross' are prayed each Friday evening during Lent at 7:00pm at Our Lady of the Valley Church. For many, the Stations of the Cross are synonymous with Lent. This devotion is also known as the "Way of the Cross," the "Via Crucis," and the "Via Dolorosa." It commemorates fourteen key events on the day of Jesus' crucifixion, the majority concerning his final walk through the streets of Jerusalem, carrying his cross. The Stations originated in medieval Europe when was prevented Christian pilgrims from visiting the Holy Land and walking along the actual route.
